A person following more Distinct Occupations than one, should insert each of them in the order of their importance.

1. The Titles of PEERS and other PERSONS OF RANK to be |

2. MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT, MAGISTRATES, ALDERMEN, and other important public Officers, to state their profoccupation, if any, after their official rank or title.

3. All persons serving in the ARMY AND NAYY, to state their rank and the branch of the service to which they belong. Officers to state whether on the Active or the Retired List; For every from the Army and Navy to state the service to which they belong.

4. All persons in the CIVIL SERVICE to state their rank, and

the department or branch to which they belong; those retired or superannuated to be distinguished.
