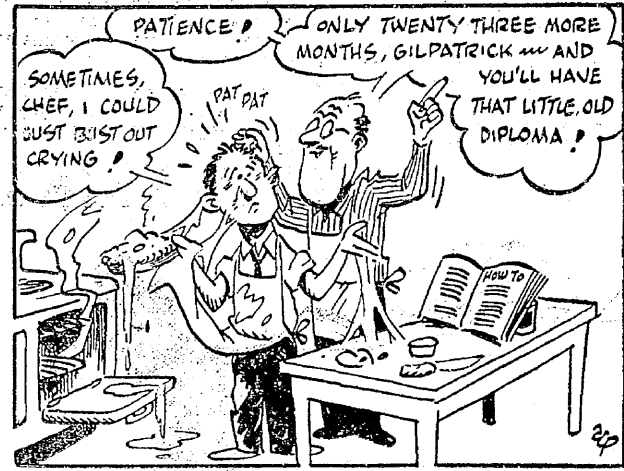


20 Years' Training In Cooking Boiled Down To 2 at Edison School



(This is the third of four articles about the training of restaurant chefs at Edison Technical School.)

MEN from Europe and other parts of the world, who traditionally have been America's chefs, got their experience the hard way, and it took them 20 years to become initiated into the kitchen secrets. The caste system was jealously maintained by those on top, who bitterly resented the idea that their trade could be learned any quicker.

Paul Muellet, originator and head of the culinary arts department at the Edison Technical School, proceeds on the principle that no one can learn to be a chef without intense study and hard work.

However, he's convinced the knowledge gained in 20 years by a European can be imparted in two years by a thoroughly American system in which experts share their experience and their recipes with the students.

Students have to be in earnest before they are accepted for the course. They are interviewed just as if they were applying for a job. Once they are in, they work seven hours a day, five days a week. Since they pay to go to school and receive nothing for their work, most of them have to work outside, too. Many students are employed in the industry.

THE curriculum takes about two years. Some students, with previous experience, and working in a restaurant on the side, finish in less than that time. Others take longer. They can begin the course any time, because someone always is leaving for a job, and the meals go on as long as classes are in session in the rest of Edison. Faculty and students buy 500 "practice" meals a day, and make the food and restaurant trades department self-sustaining.

Muellet, Swiss-born and a veteran of the old system in both European and American restaurants, hates the lopsided results often obtained by it. European

OSLO HOTELS RESERVED FOR U. S. VISITORS TO OLYMPICS

Despite the shortage of hotel space in Oslo for the Olympic Winter Games, Americans who arrange now for trips to Norway for the sports festival are assured of accommodations, an airline official said in Seattle today.

Harry B. Dalgaard, district traffic and sales manager for Pay'n Save Airlines in Oslo, said two of Oslo's best hotels have been set aside for exclusive occupancy of American tourists for the Winter Games.

"The 300 hotel rooms can be sold only in the United States," Dalgaard explained.

Dalgaard is in Seattle to discuss the air line's plans for flying Games travelers from this area to Oslo.

"One of the features of the Winter Olympics which Americans will like is a ticket good for all events during the 11-day Olympic program," Dalgaard said. "It will cost \$42."

Dalgaard pointed out that airlines flying to the Scandinavian countries will have winter-season rates in effect at the time of the Olympic Games February 14 through 25.
