April 19 through May 13. It is being brought here by the Seattle Weavers' Guild.

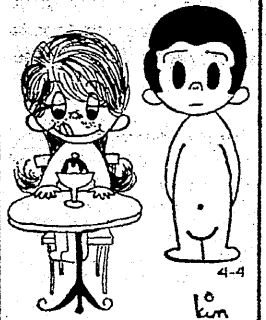
Included will be 55 rugs and several wall hangings by El Tepeyac, Mexico, weavers. They are bright, boldly designed works of hand-spun natural wool.

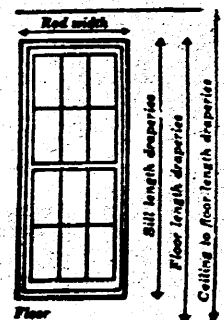
