

KEYNSHAM.—*Petty Sessions*, (Friday).—Daniel May, of Keynsham, an old offender, charged with committing a trespass in search of game, at Queen Charlton, on the 19th of March last, was fined 40s. and costs, or in default of payment to be committed for one calendar month's hard labour.—Henry Short, of Farmborough, was fined 1s. and costs, or seven days' imprisonment, for allowing his horse to stray on the highway, on the 2nd inst.—Wm. Withers, of Saltford, for an assault on Sarah Bond, was fined 2s. 6d. and costs, or seven days' hard labour.—Henry Vining, of Whitchurch, James Flower, of Pensford, and Daniel Miles, of Whitchurch, were fined 7s. 6d. and costs for being drunk and riotous.—Charles Smith, of Saltford, summoned by the inland revenue for killing a hare at Saltford, on the 22nd of January last, without having a license, was fined in the mitigated penalty of £5, with a recommendation from the bench that the case should be further investigated by the board above.—Frederick Stevens, Robert Hazell, John Biggs, of Pile-street, Bristol, and James Holbrook, of Redcliff Mead-lane, summoned for wilfully damaging a direction post, at Queen Charlton, the property of the Keynsham Highway Board, were fined 1s. each, and damages 2s. 6d. each and costs, or in default of immediate payment to be committed for seven days' hard labour.
