of me *Henry Young* of Rudgwick in the County of Sussex Farmer I direct all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses to be paid with all convenient speed after my decease give and bequeath unto my beloved wife *Levy* five pounds a year to be paid quarterly during her life and the following a pair of my flowered furniture for her use and disposal I bequeath and furniture 1 feather bed bolster and 2 pillows 1 patterned bed quilt 1 blanket 1 deal chest of drawers 1 deal chest 1 oak table 1 wing looking glass 1 half a dozen china cups and saucers 1 tea pot 1 milk pot 1 stop basin all her wearing apparel and her wedding ring but in case I should survive my wife *Levy* all the above articles of my flowered furniture in her wearing apparel and her wedding ring I give and bequeath unto her daughter *Mary* the wife of *Matthias James* for her absolute use and purpose I direct that my trustees hereinafter named or the survivor of them or the heirs or assigns of our survivor shall and so make an act and absolutely dispose of by auction sale or private contract within 12 months after my decease all and singular my freehold estate situate at *Brook Street* otherwise *Monkton Wood* in the parish of *St. John* in the County of *Sussex* also give and bequeath unto my son *Henry* fifty pounds out of my real and personal property over and above his share of the *Residue and Remainder* of my real and personal property I give in unto my son *Henry Young* and my daughter *Charlotte* wife of *James* a second of *Westboro Green* *Stamant* to be equally divided between them share and share alike for my daughter *Charlotte* and her husband *James* a second to have one half during his or her life and after both of their decease to be equally divided between their children if any if no child at their decease the whole of the money to be paid first to my son *Henry* if living if not to be equally divided between his children share and share alike and I do hereby appoint my daughter *Henry Young* and *James* second of *Stamant* my executors of this my will and I hereby revoke all other wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four signed sealed published and declared by the said *Henry Young* as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses hereto. *Henry Young* & his mark *J.
